2014 Report on the Implementation of Conservation and Management Measure 2.01 for Trachurus murphyi

Effort Management

Under the Interim Measures Vanuatu has a limit of total fishing capacity of 31,220 GRT.

In 2014, only two Vanuatu trawlers were deployed to the fishery with a total capacity of 15,610 GRT.

One of the vessels suffered a main engine breakdown in July 2013, with repairs being completed in June 2014 when the vessel re-entered the fishery.

Catch Management

The jack mackerel catch limit for Vanuatu vessels in 2014 was 19,966 tonnes. The actual catch taken was 15,364 tonnes. In addition, 500 tonnes of the Vanuatu catch limit was transferred for the 2014 season to the Republic of Korea.

Data Collection and Reporting

Monthly catch reports and transshipment data were provided within the required timeframe. VMS data and a list of active vessels were also provided.

Verified annual catch data and tow-by-tow data were provided to the Secretariat for 2013.

An annual report and observer data were provided to the 2014 Science Working Group meeting.

The Secretariat was advised when the Vanuatu catch reached 70% of its catch limit.

Monitoring and Control

VMS is fitted on both Vanuatu flagged trawlers and on the three Vanuatu flagged carrier vessels.

Observer data on the length frequencies of the catch were collected for 120 fishing days in the 2014 season out of a total 296 days fished, giving a observer coverage rate of 40.5%.

Vanuatu provided a list of vessels authorised to fish within the SPRFMO Convention Area in the prescribed timeframe.

CMM 2.06 Establishment of a Vessel Monitoring System in the SPRFMO Convention Area

All Vanuatu flagged vessels authorised to fish in SPRFMO Convention Area are fitted with VMS systems.

CMM 2.07 Minimum Standards of Inspection in Port
