6. SPRFMO Meetings

The **Fifth Commission Meeting** was held from 18 to 22 January 2017 in Adelaide, Australia.

The Fourth Compliance and Technical Committee met prior to the fifth Commission meeting (14-16 January 2017).

The **Fourth Finance & Administration Committee** met during the Fifth Commission Meeting.

The **Fifth Meeting of the Scientific Committee** was held from 23 to 28 September 2017 in Shanghai, China. It was preceded by a 2-day Workshop covering squid and deep-water topics, on 21 and 22 September.

7. Cooperation with Other Organisations

In 2017, SPRFMO representatives were invited to attend several meetings relevant to the activities and objectives of SPRFMO. Article 31 of the Convention (Cooperation with Other Organisations) calls for appropriate cooperation with other RFMOs, the FAO and other relevant organisations. The Secretariat coordinates attendance of these meetings by delegates or staff members, bearing in mind the availability of funds and time. Apart from the thematic and strategic relevance for SPRFMO, in several cases, the offer by the organiser to fully or partially cover travel expenses facilitated a participation by SPRFMO representatives. The following meetings were attended by SPRFMO representatives:

ABNJ Deep Seas Project Steering Committee (report). 7 - 9 February 2017 at FAO, Rome, Italy. SPRFMO was represented by Dr. Jianye Tang (China) (report) and Mr. Timothy Costelloe (Cook Island) (report). Normally, for reasons of continuity, staff members endeavour to attend, if possible. SPRFMO is a partner in this project and attends the Steering Committee meetings to ensure that SPRFMO views and interests are appropriately considered and to report back to the SC and the Commission on progress made, obstacles encountered and next steps. The Project on Sustainable Management and Biodiversity Conservation of Deep Sea Living Resources in Areas Beyond National Jurisdiction has the objective to achieve efficiency and sustainability in the use of deep-sea living resources and biodiversity conservation in the ABNJ, through the systematic application of an ecosystem approach for: (i) improving sustainable management practices for DSFM taking into account the impacts on related ecosystems; (ii) improving the protection of VMEs and components of EBSAs; and (iii) testing improved area-based planning tools for deep-sea ecosystems.

6th and final meeting of the New Zealand VME Stakeholder Advisory Group. 28 February 2017, Wellington, New Zealand. *SPRFMO was represented by Craig Loveridge (Data Manager)*, This group provided a forum for exchanging ideas and information related to New Zealand's South Pacific VME project, which also carries relevance to SPRFMO (refer NZ paper COMM5-INF05).

SPRFMO SC, Third Workshop: Deepwater Working Group. 23 - 25 May 2017, Hobart, Australia (Report). The Data Manager, Craig Loveridge, attended the meeting and provided secretarial support.

November and 15 November 2017, Wellington New Zealand (see COMM6-INF05). The Secretariat was represented by Craig Loveridge (Data Manager), and occasionally by Johanne Fischer (Executive Secretary) and Osvaldo Urrutia (Commission Chairperson). The main scope of these meetings was to gather and document stakeholder views on the nature and content of a revised conservation and management measure for bottom fisheries in the SPRFMO Area.

Our Oceans Conference. 4-6 October 2017 in Malta (report). SPRFMO was represented by Johanne Fischer (Executive Secretary). Since 2014, the Our Ocean conferences have invited ocean leaders to commit to change for the conservation of oceans while also providing an important global platform for exchanging views, coordination and networking. In 2017, the conference focused on marine pollution, marine protected areas, maritime security, sustainable blue economy, sustainable fisheries and climate change. Regional fisheries played a major part in the 2017 conference, and several SPRFMO Members communicated significant commitments and efforts of more than 100 million Euros under the agenda item for sustainable fisheries, i.e. Australia, Chile, European Union (also Spain and Portugal), Korea, Chinese Taipei and USA. In addition, several IGOS and RFMOs made substantive promises and important announcements related to sustainable fisheries, e.g. FAO, ILO, IOC, GFCM, GEF, and ICES. These and other commitments have been compiled in a pdf document and an interactive map.

FAO/CPPS Workshop "Fortalecimiento de la coordinación regional para la lucha contra la pesca INDNR en aguas bajo jurisdicción nacional de los Estados miembros de la CPPS " (Strengthening the regional coordination to fight IUU fishing in waters under national jurisdiction of CPPS member States). **15 - 17 November 2017, Santiago, Chile** (meeting website). Johanne Fischer attended and gave a presentation on "Los mecanismos de coordinación y herramientas para el combate a la pesca illegal en la Organización Regional de Ordencxión Pesquera del Pacífico Sur (SPRFMO)" (The mechanisms of coordination and tools for the fight against illegal fishing in SPRFMO). The workshop had the objective to advance the creation of a regional coordination mechanism among CPPS member States to fight against transboundary IUU fishing, accurately monitor the fisheries and manage the marine resources.

In addition to the participation in meetings shown above, in 2017 the Secretariat also had the opportunity of **strengthening its work relationship with the CCAMLR Secretariat** through:

A short-term placement at the CCAMLR Secretariat, 29 May – 2 June 2017, Hobart, Australia. Craig Loveridge, Data Manager, participated for one week in the activities and operations of the CCAMLR Secretariat with the goal to experiencing and discussing best practices and different approaches to similar services and activities. During this time, the data manager had very useful discussions on a broad range of issues including (but not limited to):

- Operation of CLS Themis (the same software that SPRFMO will use for its VMS)
- Data management and information sharing
- Leveraging CCAMLRs scientific expertise at assessing toothfish stocks
- Management of the Scheme of International Scientific Observation
- Vessels of common interest and MCS
- Website access arrangements and meeting support

9. Fishery Statistics

The Secretariat has received the 2016 Annual Catch Reports from all Commission Members and CNCPs who fished in the SPRFMO Area in accordance with CMM 02-2017. These reports show that a total of 305 554 tonnes of fishery resources were taken from the SPRFMO Area during 2016 (details are reported in COMM6-INF03).

The Secretariat has processed approximately 1 700 data files received during the year. A summary of those files is shown in Annex I.

10.Budget

The budget approved by the Commission for the financial year starting 1 July 2017 and ending 30 June 2018 was NZ\$ 1 164 000.

In 2017 contributions in full were received from all Members. Voluntary CNCP contributions were received from Liberia and Panama. In addition, a voluntary contribution of NZ\$ 27 368 was received from China.
