Proposal to Amend CMM 10-2017 on the Compliance and Monitoring Scheme European Union



EU PROPOSAL TO AMEND CMM 10-2017¹

Conservation and Management Measure for the Establishment of a Compliance and Monitoring Scheme in the SPRFMO Convention Area

The Commission of the South Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Organisation;

RECALLING the relevant provisions of the Convention on the Conservation and Management of High Seas Fishery Resources in the South Pacific Ocean, in particular Articles 24, 25 and 26;

NOTING that Article 24 of the Convention requires each Member of the Commission to implement any Conservation and Management Measures (CMMs) adopted by the Commission;

MINDFUL of the rights and obligations of Members of the Commission in promoting the effective implementation of CMMs adopted by the Commission;

NOTING that in accordance with international law, Members have responsibilities to exercise effective control over their flagged vessels and their nationals;

RECOGNISING the importance of introducing a robust compliance review mechanism by which the compliance of each Member is examined in depth on a yearly basis;

ADOPTS the following CMM to establish a SPRFMO Compliance and Monitoring Scheme (CMS):

I. PURPOSE

- 1. The purpose of the SPRFMO CMS is to ensure that Members and Cooperating Non-Contracting Parties (CNCPs) implement and comply with obligations arising under the Convention and CMMs adopted by the Commission. The CMS is designed to:
- a) Assess implementation by Members and CNCPs of their obligations under the Convention and/or CMMs;
- b) Identify areas in which technical assistance or capacity building may be needed to assist Members and CNCPs to achieve compliance;
- c) Identify aspects of CMMs which may require improvement or amendment to facilitate or advance their implementation. These findings and subsequent actions shall not necessarily replace any review procedure established in accordance with Article 30 of the Convention;
- d) Recommend action against <u>inadequate or unsatisfactory implementation of the Convention and/or CMMs</u> through preventive and remedial options that should include a range of possible responses that take into account the reasons for and degree of <u>inadequate or unsatisfactory implementation</u>, as assigned in accordance with paragraph 13(a).

II. SCOPE AND APPLICATION

- 2. At each annual meeting, with the assistance of the Compliance and Technical Committee (CTC), the Commission shall evaluate Members' and CNCPs' compliance with their obligations arising from the Convention, in particular Articles 24, 25 and 26, and CMMs adopted by the Commission included in Annex II of this measure. The assessment should cover the period 1 October of the previous year till 30 September of the current year.
- 3. The Commission shall also review <u>Implementation Remedies</u>. Action Plans by <u>Members or CNCPs</u>, recommendations on compliance adopted by the Commission and follow-up actions committed by <u>Members and CNCPs</u>, in accordance with this CMM, in previous years' Final Compliance Reports in order to assess how they have been implemented by the concerned Members and CNCPs, the CTC or the Commission.
- 4. Each year, the Commission shall consider and identify whether compliance with additional CMMs should be evaluated annually or on another basis.

III. ANNUAL MEMBER AND CNCP REPORTS

- 5. a) At least <u>75</u> days before the start of the CTC meeting Members and CNCPs should provide the Secretariat with their <u>Annual Reports</u> as required by Article 24 (2) of the Convention and any other relevant CMMs on the basis of the template at Annex II.
 - b) The Secretariat shall amend the template in Annex II as soon as practicable after the Commission meeting to incorporate obligations from new or amended CMMs adopted by the Commission.

IV. DRAFT IMPLEMENTATION REPORT

- 6. Prior to the annual meeting of the CTC, the SPRFMO Secretariat shall compile information received from Members and CNCPs including their Annual Reports, data collection programmes of the Commission and, where appropriate, any suitably documented information provided by other relevant sources, and shall prepare the Draft Implementation Report using the template in Annex III.
- 7. The SPRFMO Secretariat shall provide to each Member and CNCP its respective section of the Initial Draft Implementation, Report no later than 60 days before the annual CTC meeting.
- 8. Each Member and CNCP shall comment on the Draft <u>Implementation Report providing any additional</u> information it deems suitable to the Secretariat no later than 30 days before the annual CTC meeting. This information shall, as appropriate:
- a) provide additional information, clarifications, amendments or corrections necessary to address the potential compliance issues identified or respond to any other request for additional information;
- b) identify any particular causes of the potential compliance issues or difficulties with respect to implementation of the obligation in question, or circumstances which may mitigate the potential compliance issues;
- c) identify technical assistance or capacity building needed to assist Members and CNCPs to address potential compliance issues.
- 9. The SPRFMO Secretariat shall compile a revised Draft <u>Implementation</u> Report which shall include all information, clarifications and comments provided by Members and CNCPs in response to the initial Draft <u>Implementation</u> Report, as described in paragraph 8 above.
- 10. The SPRFMO Secretariat shall circulate to Members and CNCPs the revised Draft Implementation Report no later than 14 days before the annual CTC meeting, by making it available on the non-public section of the Commission website. As soon as practicable after posting it, the Secretariat shall notify Members and CNCPs of its availability.

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V. PROVISIONAL IMPLEMENTATION REPORT

11. At its annual meeting, the CTC shall consider the Draft Implementation Report, and may take into account any additional information provided during the meeting of the CTC by Members, CNCPs and other observers, including non-governmental organisations and other organisations concerned with matters relevant to the implementation of the Convention. CTC shall identify any potential implementation issues for each Member and CNCP.

12. On the basis of the information provided, the CTC shall develop a Provisional Implementation_Report, based on the issues identified in respect of that Member or CNCP and using the criteria and considerations for the assessing the implementation review set out in Annex I. The Provisional Implementation Report shall include Implementation Remedies for recommendation to the Commission, Action Plans by Members or CNCPs and other recommendations on implementation issues adopted by the Commission and follow-up actions committed by Members and CNCPs in accordance with Annex I. The Provisional Implementation Report shall be forwarded to the Commission for consideration at the annual meeting.

VI. FINAL IMPLEMENTATION REPORT

13. The Commission shall consider the Provisional Implementation Report provided by the CTC, and adopt a Final Implementation. Report at its annual meeting, which shall include:

d) Additional obligations that should be reviewed under the CMS;

- Any other action the Commission shall deem appropriate to address insufficient responses to noncompliance noted in the Final Implementation Report or to promote compliance with the Convention, CMMs and other obligations reviewed in the CMS, including Implementation Remedies prescribed by the Commission and Implementation Action Plans by Members or CNCPs which may be amended as determined by the Commission.
- The Final Implementation Report shall also contain an executive summary setting out any recommendations or observations from the Commission regarding the issues listed in paragraph 13 of this

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VII. OTHER RULES

15. All the relevant information arising from the SPRFMO CMS procedure shall be subjected to the relevant applicable SPRFMO rules and procedures regarding the use of information and transparency. Therefore, the Draft and Provisional Implementation Reports shall not constitute public domain data, but the Final Implementation Report and the executive summary shall be public domain data.

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16. The Commission shall take a graduated response to insufficient responses to non-compliance, taking into account the type, severity, degree and cause of the non-compliance in question. The Commission should develop, as a matter of priority, a process to complement the CMS that identifies a range of specific responses to non-compliance events that may be applied by the Commission through the implementation of the CMS. This shall include penalties and any other actions as may be necessary to promote compliance with the Convention, CMMs and other obligations included in the CMS.

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17. This CMM shall be reviewed at the regular meeting of the Commission in 2021.

Except as described in paragraph 11 above, each Member and CNCP participating in the *Trachurus murphyi* fishery shall collect, verify, and provide all required data to the Executive Secretary, in accordance with the SPRFMO Data Standards CMM 2.02 and the templates available on the SPRFMO website, including an annual catch report.

Paragraph 15:

Members and CNCPs participating in the *Trachurus murphyi* fisheries shall implement a vessel monitoring system (VMS) in accordance with the SPRFMO Data Standards CMM 2.02 and other relevant CMMs adopted by the Commission. These VMS data shall be provided to the Executive Secretary within 10 days of each quarter in the format prescribed by the SPRFMO Data Standards CMM 2.02 and using the templates on the SPRFMO website.
