I am pleased to write to you, regarding Peru's request to continue participating as Cooperating non-Contracting Party (CNCP) of the South Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Organization (SPRFMO).

In accordance with the provisions of Decision 1.02, of the Rules for Cooperating non-Contracting Parties, the following information that supports Peru's request for continued CNCP status is provided for the relevant purposes:

a. Reason for seeking CNCP status.

Peru has actively participated in the negotiations of the SPRFMO, has an interest in fisheries managed by it, and supports the objective of the Convention.

b. Commitment to cooperate fully in the implementation of conservation and management measures adopted by the Commission and to ensure that fishing vessels flying its flag and fishing in the Convention Area and, to the greatest extent possible, its nationals, comply with the provisions of the Convention and conservation and management measures adopted by the Commission.

Peru is committed to full cooperation for the implementation of all measures adopted by the SPRFMO.

c. Explicit commitment to accept high seas boarding and inspections in accordance with the Commission's procedures on high seas boarding and inspection, once they have been adopted; full data on its historical fisheries in the Convention Area, including nominal catches, number/type of vessels, name of fishing vessels, fishing effort and fishing areas.

There is no objection or any situation that prevents Peru take on this commitment.



- d. All the data and information members of the Commission are required to submit, in accordance with the standards adopted by the Commission.

There is no objection or any situation that prevents Peru take on this commitment.


- e. Any further relevant information as determined by the Commission.
