Chinese Taipei's Implementation report

**2014 Chinese Taipei's Annual Report
on the Implementation of Conservation and Management Measures

CMM 1.02 Conservation and management measure for Gillnets in the SPRFMO Convention Area

Taking into account the UNGA Resolution 46/215 Large-scale pelagic driftnet fishing and its impact on the living marine resources of the world's oceans and seas, Chinese Taipei has adopted and revised when necessary from 1992 relevant Directions prohibiting its vessels from engaging in fishing activities with drift-nets on the high seas. Vessels flagged to Chinese Taipei operate with neither large-scale pelagic driftnets nor deep-water gillnets on the high seas.

CMM 1.04 Conservation and Management Measure Establishing a List of Vessels Presumed to Have Carried Out Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated Fishing Activities in the SPRFMO Convention Area

Chinese Taipei did not detect in 2014 any vessel presumed to have carried out IUU activities in the Convention Area.

CMM 2.01 Conservation and Management Measure for *Trachurus murphyi*

Chinese Taipei is not currently participating in the *Trachurus murphyi* fishery in the Convention Area, so this CMM is not applicable to Chinese Taipei.

CMM 2.02 Conservation and Management Measure on Standards for the Collection, Reporting, Verification and Exchange of Data

1. Data on fishing activities and the impacts of fishing
 - (1) Chinese Taipei has provided the data on its 2013 annual catch for Jumbo flying squid.
 - (2) Chinese Taipei has provided the information on its 2013 fishing activity with the data grouped to 5x5 degrees, including vessel number and catch for each month, and the data on its 2013 landings and transshipment for Jumbo flying squid. In addition, there was no non-target species information recorded in 2013 due to the nature of its squid jigging fishery.

2. Vessel Monitoring System – frequency of reporting

All vessels of Chinese Taipei authorized to fish in the Convention Area are equipped with VMS and have been requested to report their VMS positions in accordance with its domestic regulations.

CMM 2.03 Management of Bottom fishing in the SPRFMO Convention Area

Chinese Taipei is not currently participating in the Bottom fishery in the Convention Area, so this CMM is not applicable to Chinese Taipei.

CMM 2.04 Minimising bycatch of seabirds in the SPRFMO Convention Area

The vessels of Chinese Taipei currently operating in the Convention Area are not using either demersal longline or trawl gear. This CMM is not applicable to Chinese Taipei.

CMM 2.05 Establishment of the Commission record of Vessels authorised to fish in the Convention Area

Chinese Taipei has provided a list of its vessels authorized to fish in the Convention Area for 2015.

CMM 2.06 Establishment of the Vessel Monitoring System in the SPRFMO Convention Area

SPRFMO VMS has not yet been developed. This CMM is currently not applicable.

CMM 2.07 Minimum Standards of inspection in Port

This CMM is not applicable as it does not enter into force until 1 January 2015.
