Data verification

Para 4: Please describe the systems you use to verify your SPRFMO fishery data.

Curacao has instituted a VMS requirement for all Curacao flagged vessels engaged in transhipment operations in all Conventions Areas, including SPRFMO area. Our vessels are equipped with LEO model units which are geo-localization terminals used for acquiring positions using GPS constellation and the reception/transmission of data using the Iridium system. The units also comprise of tablets with pre-programmed e-forms which can be sent directly to the fishery monitoring center (FMC).Curacao also has a condition for all of our vessels to ensure that the VMS units are operational at all times. In case a VMS unit is found inoperable, a vessel is required to report immediately to the flag. The VMS units are tamper-proof and will emit an electronic message if tampered with. Curacao has developed a Halios Catch Management system to monitor the catch of the fishing vessels and the cargo vessels real time online. After arranging the secure VMS data exchange between CLS and SPRFMO, SPRFMO can have surveillance on our vessels. We hope for the upcoming year to improve the security and confidentiality of the VMS data.

Fishing High Seas Licensing and Registration Procedures for Curacao. In the procedures mentioned above we ask the vessel owners which are the previous flags and we approach those countries for background check if the vessel has been involved in any IUU activity. We look at the IUU list of the different RFMO'S. We approach RFMO's for background check if we have any doubts.

Para 3: Describe the measures you have taken to ensure that you are able to take effective enforcement actions against the owners of vessels flying your flag should the need arise

Curacao is since the year 2014 a full member of the ICCAT. Curacao has a robust Fishery Monitoring Center and Control Centre to monitor 24/7 all vessels under the flag of Curacao operating in international waters. It has a full fledged electronic reporting system of CLS consisting of Web Themis system to monitor the fishing and carrier vessels. Curacao has also developed a Halios Catch Management System for fishing and carrier vessels so that the captains on board of the vessels reports the catches real time through a tablet. Curacao has also local observer on board of the vessels who that observer fishing activities on board of the vessels. In the harbour where the vessels discharge, Curacao has two Companies SGS and CEMI that reports the landing and discharge of the catches into the harbors(in the former situation Abidjan and Dakar). Curacao has a traceability scheme to monitor the fish from net to to plate before issuing a catch certificate. Curacao exports yearly around 30000 tons of Atlantic Tuna in the European market, mainly Spain.
