# 1. Background

Financial Regulation 2.4: For the budget categories "Scientific Support (SC) and Developing States (DS), unspent appropriations may accrue between financial years, up to a limit of \$50,000 for the SC and \$30,000 for the DS. Beyond these levels such funds shall be treated as surplus and transferred to the accumulated surplus account. The Commission will review these categories once the defined level has reached or after 4 years, whichever occurs first, and at least every four years thereafter."

# 2. Status of Scientific Support (SC) Fund:

### 2.1 Year-to-date Status of SC Fund

In accordance with Financial Regulation 2.4, the Secretariat established a separate account for Scientific Support Fund in 2017. This Fund contains the accumulated unspent appropriations from previous Financial Years (since Financial Year 2016) under the budget item for Scientific Support; it shall be reviewed by the Commission at the Annual Meeting in 2020. The table below shows the year- to- date status of the Scientific Support Fund up to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019.

## 3. Other Resources

## 3.1. Voluntary contribution from the European Union (EU)

The EU Grant € 100,000 (NZ\$ 167,000 approximately) - Support to jack mackerel assessment and data validation in SPRFMO. The SPRFMO Secretariat will coordinate the implementation of those actions linked with the SC multiannual work plan. This grant from the EU is being used for the implementation of this specified SC related project in SPRFMO and although it is not considered as part of the SC Fund it is a relevant contribution to the SC activities.

## 3.2. Voluntary contribution from China

China has made a voluntary contribution to SPRFMO for an amount of NZ\$ 29,230 to support squid sampling and genetic research in the SPRFMO Convention area. As requested by the Chairperson for the squid working group (Dr. Gang Li), this contribution will be distributed amongst the Members who are participating in the current research. The table below shows the year-to- date funding status for this research activity:

The Secretariat has been and will be continuously working together with the Commission and Scientific Committee to optimize the financial resources made available to achieve the objectives set by the Commission and exploring the ways to use these funds efficiently.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> For the Financial Year 2019-2020, the Commission allocated in the annual budget (<u>COMM7- Report ANNEX6c: Budget</u>) NZ\$ 30,000 to the Developing States Fund to provide travel support to the Developing States Members to participate in the two SPRFMO meetings (the 7<sup>th</sup> SC Meeting & 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting).

A maximum 40% (NZ\$ 12,000) shall be allocated for participation in the meeting or workshops of the Scientific Committee (<u>Financial Regulation Annex 1 para 5</u>). All applications submitted before the due date for Travel Support SPRFMO 7<sup>th</sup> SC Meeting were assessed at the Secretariat in accordance with <u>Financial Regulation Schedule D</u> (Selection and Evaluation Criteria to be used by the Secretariat for Assessing Applications for Travel Support (Article 1 c)).

Due to the number of applications the Secretariat received, the very limited funding available and the evaluation scores favouring when there is one representative of a developing State Member participating in the meeting, only two scientists were granted support to participate in the  $7^{th}$  SC meeting.
